




They are study reading procedures represented before reading the topic by retrieving previous information related to the topic, and targeting new information in the form of questions, and after reading, the student records the answers he found to his questions, and what he learned from the subject.

It seeks to teach the student: how to read, and gain him the experience of reading topics through their titles, thinking about them, then revising, updating his memory, reviewing his information, and thinking about what the text means to him after reading.


